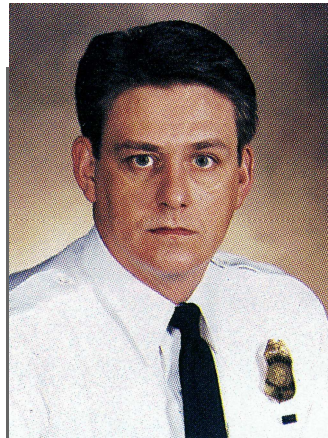

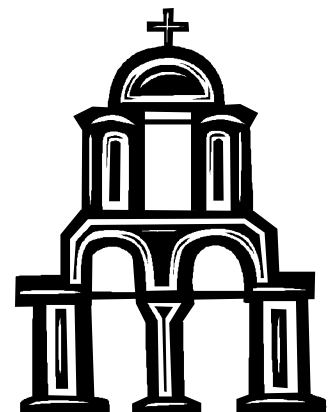

### Retiree Secretary Message (cont.)

Active-duty Dayton Det. Theresa Lawson, through her husband, Dayton retiree Bill Lawson, provided an update on Phil Olinger earlier this week. Several people from her unit went to MVH to visit Phil. Between the chemotherapy, medicine and exhaustion, Phil was barely able to stay awake to talk. They made a decision to refrain from visiting Phil to allow his family to have the time while he is awake and coherent. Theresa further reported that an ultra sound was done to determine the amount of swelling in Phil's stomach and body but, at last report, they did not have the results. His ammonia levels were high and his white count continues to fall. Within the week a CAT scan is being done to see if the chemotherapy is effective. The doctor also wanted to put Phil in ICU on Monday evening, but he talked the doctor out of it. Financially, the Olinger family is getting by but some officers are currently looking into setting up a college fund at Code Credit Union for Phil's two young sons.

This is an update on the DPH Project. Eight (8) major display cases from the DPH Exhibit are still located on the first floor of the Safety Building. Since December 2008, these cases have been on loan from Carillon Historical Park and will remain on temporary display for the benefit of the visiting public and our members. The DPH Project was able to afford the cost of this smaller history production thanks to the proceeds from last year's Annual FOP Golf Outing fundraiser. The golf outing organizer, **Jim Krauskopf**, and his committee deserve credit for this exhibit being at the Safety Building.

One of the efforts that has been undertaken is ensuring that our Lodge has as complete an archive as possible of DPD, Dayton FOP and member-related publications (such as softball tourney programs). The inventory of the contents of our three Lodge Display Cases have produced well over 150 books, event programs, etc. going back to 1897 thus far

A number of items are needed to complete the written and pictorial record of Dayton PD and Dayton FOP Lodge 44. There have been two e-mail requests sent to our retired membership for publications and many have responded. We are grateful for the publication donations made by retired members **Ron Labatzky, Mike Sammons, Bruce Osborn** (twice), **Ralph Young, Rick Iddings, Bob Caspar, Skip Beutle**, and **Gary Melson** as well as active-duty members **Jonathon Seiter, Jonathon Ross** and **Frank Navarre**. Retirees **Sandi Thorp** and **Don Vanzant** and active-duty member **Judy Abshire** have advised that they have items to donate as well. The word has spread and we've also received items from the daughter of Plwm. Nancy [McCorkle] Bolander (1945-55), the niece of Ptl. Dale Knoche (1926-52) and Dr. Thomas Kernan, the grandson of Det. Sgt. John Kernan (1896-1935).

Members are still being asked to donate publications (particularly if they are going to be discarded otherwise) including:

The only 2 **National Police Softball Tournament programs** that are missing from our collection: **1971** and **1972 programs** (1st and 2nd held in Cleveland, the only two tournneys not held in Dayton).

**Programs** from the eight (8) **State FOP Conferences hosted by Dayton**, especially first Conference in **1940** as well as the **1985** and **1991 Conferences**, the 51st and 57th respectively. Also, delegate handbooks and Ohio Police Magazine editions from *any* of the eight (8) Dayton Conferences are requested.

**Policeman Ball Programs** from any year. The Ball first began in 1940 and has been a continuous annual event for 50 years since 1958.

Original booklets/printings from both officer and supervisor **labor agreements**.

As a final note, the DPH Project's research is ongoing but could not have been as successful as it has had it not been for the assistance of retired members **Bob Keen, Lee Slife, Norm Emmons, Joe Tye, John Ness, Bale Bales, Barry Overholser, Joe Moore, George Satalia, Gary Lincks, Rubel Hicks, Roger DeLong, Bill Howard, Leo Budenz, Karl Clauss, Ron Labatzky** as well as Jack Barstow, the grandson of Chief Rudy Wurstner (1902-49), and Plwm. Dixie [Belt] Hinders (ca. 1955). Thanks to all and keep the information and publications coming.

As 1880 approached, one-man patrol became more attractive to the command. The City was expanding as the population increased by nearly 10,000. Residential migration was primarily eastward in proximity to the canal and less appreciably across two west Dayton bridges. One-man beat patrol allowed the police force to spread its limited manpower over greater area.

The Central Police House (and jail) on Sixth near Tecumseh was central to downtown and east Dayton but was a distance from west Dayton. Prisoners arrested there were being walked by patrolmen as far as two miles to the jail. In 1879, a sub-station was established on W. Fourth between Broadway and the railroad. A shed attached to the house served as an overnight jail.

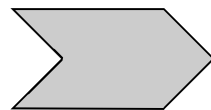

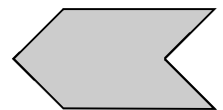
